What Does the Bible Say About Eternal Life and the Resurrection of the Body?

Everyone wonders what eternal life will be like, but the Bible does not give many details. At death we will enter an intermediate state until the second coming of Jesus. Then, all who have ever lived will be resurrected for a final judgment. Those who are saved will receive new glorified bodies and take their place with God, but the wicked will be cast into hell.

The Roman Catholic Church's teaching says, except those who are saved are said to undergo a process of purification after death to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the perfection of heaven.

Resurrection of the Dead

When Christ comes again, there will be a resurrection of all the dead. Both those who are saved and the wicked will be resurrected at some point in time. Those who are saved will receive new glorified bodies and take their place with God in heaven, but the wicked will be cast into hell (**Matthew 5:29-30, 10:28, 18:8-9, 25:31-46, Mark 9:43-47, John 5:28-29, Acts 24:15, Revelation 20:12-15**).

Jesus said, *"Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his [Christ's] voice and come out - those who have done good will rise to live, and those who have done evil will rise to be condemned."* (**John 5:28-29**)

Our new glorified bodies will be different from our old earthly bodies, but will in some ways be similar (**1 Corinthians 15:50-55, 2 Corinthians 5:1-5, Philippians 3:21-22**).

What is Heaven?

Christians frequently use the word heaven to refer to the final dwelling place of people who are saved. It is conceived as a place of perfection where people who have lived righteous lives will live eternally in God's presence. Heaven (or heavens) has several meanings in the Bible. The physical heaven refers to all of the universe beyond earth (**Genesis 1:1, Matthew 24:29, Revelation 12:3-4**).

Heaven is also the dwelling place of God (**Deuteronomy 26:15, 1 Kings 8:28-30, Matthew 5:44-45**).

When Christ returns, heaven and earth will be re-created or brought to perfection in accordance with God's will (**Isaiah 65:17, 66:22, 2 Peter 3:10-13, Revelation 21:1**). This new perfect world will be the final dwelling place for those who are saved (**John 14:2-3, 1 Peter 1:3-4**).

What is Hell?

Christians use the word hell to refer to the final dwelling place of people who are not saved. It is usually conceived as a place of eternal punishment for people who have lived wicked lives.

Several different words in the original Bible languages represent the abode of the dead or state of the dead. Many older Bible versions translated all these words as "hell," but that obscures their distinct meanings. Some newer versions leave these words untranslated to preserve the distinctions and original meanings:

What are Paradise and the "Third Heaven?"

Paradise is a Persian word that originally meant a walled garden. At the time of Jesus, many Jews believed life after death would be in a Paradise similar to the Garden of Eden. The souls of the patriarchs of Israel and righteous people would be taken to this Paradise. Jesus made reference to that belief in His Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus (**Luke 16:22-23**).

Jesus also told the thief on the cross, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (**Luke 23:43**). That suggests that Paradise is the same as the intermediate state where souls are taken immediately after death. Paradise is also mentioned in

Revelation 2:7.

Third Heaven : In Jewish tradition there were three heavens, and the apostle Paul mentioned the highest heaven, the "third heaven," in connection with Paradise in **2 Corinthians 12:2-4**. There is no further explanation, so Paul may have intended third heaven to be a synonym for Paradise.

What are Heaven and Hell Like?

The Bible does not give many details about either heaven or hell. The sayings in the Bible are often phrased in symbolic or metaphorical language.

However, the Bible does make it clear that there will be a future glorious eternal life for the righteous and punishment for the wicked (**Matthew 7:13-14, 13:40-42, 19:28-29, Luke 10:25-28, 13:24-28, John 5:28-29, 6:40, Romans 6:22-23, 8:18, Revelation 21:8**).

*"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; ... Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; ... And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.'" (**Matthew 25:31-34, 41, 46**)*

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying

*or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." (**Rev 21:3-4**)*

Will We Know Our Relatives and Friends in Heaven? Will We Still Be Married?

Nearly everyone wonders if we will know our relatives and friends in heaven. Unfortunately, the Bible does not give an answer. Most Christians assume we will someday meet up with our relatives and friends in heaven.

Jesus did say that we will not be married in heaven:

Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. (**Luke 20:34-37**)

Conclusion

When Jesus comes again, all who have lived will be resurrected from the dead for a final judgment that determines their eternal fate. There is less certainty about what will happen in the intermediate state between the time of death and Jesus' second coming.

The apostle Paul makes the analogy that our earthly bodies are like seeds that die and fall to the ground, then sprout into new, glorious forms of life (**1 Corinthians 15:35-44**).

It is only an analogy, however. The Bible uses vague and poetic language to describe heaven, hell and eternal life. Perhaps the reason we know so few details about eternal life is that, as with other spiritual matters, the reality of it is simply beyond our human ability to comprehend. As Paul wrote,

*"Now we see things imperfectly as in a poor mirror, but then we will see everything with perfect clarity. All that I know now is partial and incomplete, but then I will know everything completely, just as God knows me now." (**NLT, 1 Corinthians 13:12**).*

SUNCATS ANNUAL DAY PRESENTATION



It was quite by accident that I attended the Colors of Faith programme in our parish, conducted by Royston Braganza, CEO, Grameen Capital; expecting it to be a seminar on Career & Prayer. But I was pleasantly surprised and mildly shocked at what the discussions turned out to be. Royston began innocuously enough - about his tenure with Citibank, his involvement in Church activities, his present posting at Grameen Capital, etc.

But gradually he started talking about how we should question and challenge our faith and also discussed some Biblical passages which were not to be taken literally; this was NOT to make our faith weaker but rather to make it stronger. He first touched upon the story of Adam & Eve and how we all take it literally. In fact I used to always wonder how Adam & Eve could be our first parents and how did their 3 male children Cain, Abel and Seth procreate. I had attended a Theology Course at the Goregaon Seminary over 25 years back and towards the end of our final few sessions, Fr Julian Saldanha spoke about the story of Adam and Eve being just an allegory to explain to the people of those times that God created the world. Even the Confirmation students are told that Adam and Eve's children mated with the angels, which begged the sarcastic query - Shouldn't there be people with wings flying around?

He then spoke about many other topics: Mary's divinity, the Catholic Church's views on IVF, homosexuality, women clergy, etc., the excesses of the Catholic Church in the Dark Ages, the reason for so many breakaway sects and denominations, and many other interesting and controversial topics. He also fielded questions from the participants. I had a million questions, but thankfully asked only two and was not satisfied with the explanations. The Catholic Church does try to make changes in keeping with the times but these changes take too long. We thankfully have a Pope with a very modern outlook and who does not mince words, but at the same time is so humble and compassionate that you just can't help but love this guy!

Royston made two very valid and important points...

1) The Bible was not written by the hand of Jesus. It is a collection of many books written by different people based on narrations by elders, and hearsay accounts written and translated from the Aramaic, Hebrew and Greek languages by scribes and dic-

tated by learned men of those times; like the books of the Old Testament. The 4 Gospels were written between 60-100 years after the death of Jesus.. These were then compiled together (some books were excluded altogether for various reasons) to form what is now known as the Holy Bible.

This does NOT make the Bible a book of fiction.

2) The Bible does not pretend to be a Science or a Geography textbook; it is a book of FAITH. We have to glean the meanings of the passages, parables, psalms, etc., written in the context of that era and apply it to our daily lives today. Taking every word literally will only confuse us and belittle the larger message of the Bible.

In conclusion, I felt relieved that modern Christian Theology does address a lot of burning questions about various facts and facets of the Bible. For me the story of Creation being just an allegory, or that the Confucian Theory of Earth being the Center of the Universe mentioned in the Bible (as opposed to the Galilean Theory - since proved right -that the Sun is the Center of the Universe), and other such stuff does NOT weaken my faith. It does not matter how many books are included and/or excluded by the Catholics or the Protestants or the Orthodox Church...what should and does matter is the message Jesus gave us - **Love one another as I have loved you** - and everything falls into place neatly. Faith built on words only is no faith at all.

Faith is a combination of Words and Deeds!

Seeing the interest his discussion generated, Royston was most willing to come again and give us a more intense seminar cum workshop on these and more topics later this year. He also suggested that we could maybe start a monthly discussion club called "Christ's Café". We are indeed thankful to Frs. Elias & Byron for this mind-broadening and awakening seminar by Royston and earnestly hope that this is not a one-off affair. Healthy discussions stimulate the mind and makes us ask uncomfortable questions, but at the same time it focuses our mental abilities on topics we never would have dreamed of talking about!

The evening was made special with Royston sharing more insights on the Catholic Faith. He went on to saying that we must "Pray meaningfully" because HE is the first and the last, the beginning and the end, HE is the keeper of creation and the creator of all, HE is the architect of the Universe and the Manager of all times. HE was bruised but brought healing, HE was pierced but eased pain, HE was prosecuted but brought freedom, HE was dead but brings Life, HE was risen to power and reigns to bring Peace, HE is goodness, faithfulness, kindness & OUR GOD ! We must follow HIM because HE is the wisdom of the wise, the power of the powerful, ruler of the rulers, Leaders of all Leaders and will never leave you, forsake, overlook, mislead & never cancel your appointment in his appointment book !

The session really strengthened our faith in Jesus Our Saviour!

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
